## JEWELLER'S WINDOW SMASHED.

**"I CAN PAY FOR IT."**

---

Shortly after 1 p.m. on Monday, Constable E. J. Davis, who was on duty at the corner of King William and Grenfell streets, saw a one-legged man break the large plateglass window of Mr. P. H. Prosser's jewellery establishment in King William-street with his crutch, and also damage the goods displayed for sale. The constable asked him why he had smashed the window and the man replied, "I have plenty of money and can pay for it." When arrested he gave the name of Michael Prap.

In the Adelaide Police Court on Tuesday, Prap, a tall man, with a thin face and staring eyes, was charged with having wilfully damaged the window.

Sub-Inspector Nicholson secured a remand for two days. He said the full amount of the damage had not yet been ascertained. In the meantime the defendant could be medically examined. Prap was a Russian, and enlisted from South Australia. He had no home, and had been at the Keswick Barracks.

Bail was not granted.
