YOUNG RUSSIAN REMANDED

Michael Prap, a young man on crutches, who was arrested outside Prosser's jeweller's shop in King William street on Monday, was charged in the Adelaide Police Court on Tuesday with having on March 28 unlawfully and maliciously damaged one pane of glass, valued at £5, the property of Mr. Prosser. Sub-Inspector Nicholson asked for a remand for two days. The S.M. (Mr. G. W. Halcombe) asked defendant if he objected to the adjournment, but defendant did not reply and later said he did not understand the proceedings.

The Sub-Inspector—Perhaps it would be as well to have him medically examined in the meantime. He is a Russian and enlisted from here. He has no home, and has been down at Keswick.

The S.M.—He will be released. You don't ask for bail.

The Sub-Inspector—I think it would be advisable to have bail.

The S.M.—Remanded for two days without bail.
