COOMA POLICE COURT.

At the Cooma Police Court today, Alexander Harast, 33, labourer, a Russian subject, was charged with having on 27th May, 1919, at Yaouk, shot at Sergeant Henry Roberts, with intent to inflict grievous bodily harm. Accused was tyleased from Pentridge goal last week, after serving a sentence for housebreaking, and was brought to Cooma yesterday, on warrant, by Sergt. Rose, of Adaminaby. Mr J. L. Shropshire, P.M., occupied the Bench. Several witnesses were called, and at the conclusion of the evidence accused was committed for trial at the Cooma Quarter Sessions to be held in October. Bail of self in £150 and two sureties of £75 was allowed.

Harast pleaded guilty to another charge of having in his possession several articles, the property of Neil Cochran, of Yaouk, reasonably suspected of having been stolen, and was sentenced to 14 days' hard labour.

Stanley Hamilton, alias Reginald Hollis, 28, plumber, was remanded to the Glebe Police Court on a warrant charging him with disobeying an order of that court, for the maintenance of his wife.
