

CHANCE TO "STEADY UP."

Alice Nevola applied for an order against her husband, James Nevola, for her support under the Married Woman's

Protection Act. The case was heard in the Adelaide Police Court No. 2 on Friday, before Mr. L. H. Haslam, P.M., Mr. R. Gruneke, and Mrs. A. K. Goode. Mr. C. J. Philcox (for complainant) said the parties had been married several years, and there was one child. They lived in Hindley street until recently, when Nevola procured a house in North Adelaide. Mrs. Nevola removed to the house, but the husband did not join her. He was habitually drunk, and never paid her more than 36/ a week, although he earned from £4 10/ as a gardener. Mrs. Nevola had been obliged to go out and earn money. She asked for an order for 30/ a week for her, and 10/ a week for the child. The S.M. adjourned the hearing for a fortnight to give the defendant opportunity to return to his wife and steady up.
