

Seaman Dies Under Anaesthetic

Although medical advice was wirelessed from Melbourne to the Huddart, Parker steamer Adelong, attempts to save the life of Harry Trellick, 53, able seaman, of Noll street, Port Melbourne, who became seriously ill while the vessel was at sea, were unsuccessful.

The steamer stopped at the Semaphore anchorage yesterday on its way to Whyalla, and Trellick was rushed to the Adelaide Hospital.

Trellick, who was suffering from acute abdominal trouble, died from heart failure under the anaesthetic while an operation was being performed. He left a widow.

The City Coroner (Mr. Blackburn) deemed an inquest unnecessary.
