### Vagrants Sent to Gaol

Jacob Nevola, laborer, of Pulteney street, Adelaide, was sentenced to six weeks' imprisonment by Mr. Muirhead, P.M., in the Adelaide Police Court to-day for having been an idle and disorderly person.

Mark Langton, laborer, of the Salvation Army Home, Whitmore square, who was arrested yesterday with Nevola by Detective-Sergeant Walters and Detective Gill, was sentenced to two months' gaol for the same offence.

It was Langton's seventy-ninth conviction, and Nevola's sixty-ninth, according to the Police Prosecutor (Inspector Crafter). Nevola said he had not kept a tally of them, but that was probably the correct number. Langton admitted 50 convictions.

"Langton is known as a methylated spirits drinker," said Inspector Crafter. "He is a public nuisance."
