

THE RUSSIAN TROUBLE.

LONDON, May 13.

A party of Jews from Berdichev, who were hastening towards Zhitomir, were attacked midway on their journey, eight being killed and many wounded.

Colonel Greshner, the head of the Nijini Novgorod Gendarmarie, was shot dead while entering his house. The murderer was captured.

Four armed men attempted to explode a military powder magazine at Schugin, Russian Poland.

The social democrats at St. Petersburg urge the workers to demonstrate peaceably to-morrow, though the proclamation emphasises that the cause sometimes requires martyrs, as the horrors of "Red Sunday" had produced the Czar's rescript and M. Boulguine's commission.
