

#### BOATING ACCIDENT AT GLENELG.

F.C. Lucas has reported to the watch-house that at about 10 o'clock on Saturday morning Arthur Charles Palmer and Charles Domander, fishermen, of the cutter Mermaid, left the Glenelg Jetty in a dinghy to board the cutter. The sea was very rough at the time, and after going some distance one of the oars broke. The boat then became unmanageable, and drifted into the surf, where it capsized. The occupants were thrown into the sea. Both of them were heavily clothed, and had on oil-skin suits, which prevented them swimming. The roughness of the waves, however, washed them ashore, where they were pulled out of the water by Messrs. W. Thomas and A. Lummoore, both of Glenelg. Domander was none the worse for his immersion, but Palmer had to be carried to his home in Jetty road and be attended by Dr. O'Leary. He subsequently recovered.
