

## **CAPT. E. MARGOLIN**

**Captain E. Margolin, whose name appears in the 29th list, as having been wounded in the Dardanelles, is well known on the Murchison and in Geraldton. He came to West Australia about 15 years ago with Mr L. Goldberg, being a relative of Mrs Goldberg. After being with M. Goldberg for some time at Lawlers, he acted as agent for Messrs Silbert and Sharpe at Leonora and Kookynie and subsequently commenced business as a wholesale produce merchant at Nannine and Meekatharra, removing about three years ago to Collie, where he conducted a similar business. He always took a great interest in military matters, and was one of the first to volunteer his services. Writing from the Dardanelles a few**

**weeks ago to Mr Goldberg, he said: "We are at present very near to the real thing, and expect in a day or two we shall be in it to the neck. We are in splendid spirits and health and everybody is prepared to do his**

and everybody is prepared to do his best. Elsewhere he stated that numbers of refugees from Palestine had arrived in Egypt, and they were all hoping the Turks would be driven out of that country.
