

## GRAFTON POLICE COURT.

Yesterday, before Mr. J. L. Shropshire, P.M.,

John Nelson Allen pleaded guilty to a charge of drunkenness. Sergeant Swan stated that Allen was convicted on the same charge on the 3rd of the month, and in the middle of last month also. The P.M. imposed a fine of £1 or seven days' hard labour in Grafton Gaol.

Lionel Jacobs and Kelly Mansfield were charged with larceny in company. The first charge was that they obtained £40 by a trick, the property of Harry Baff. Mr. Pollack (McGuren and Pollack) appeared for the defence. Sergeant Swan applied for a remand till Monday for the production of evidence. This was granted, and bail was fixed at self in £60, and two sureties of £30, or one of £60. The second charge was that they obtained £18 by a trick, the property of Michael Kekoff. The police again applied for a remand, and Mr. Pollack asked that the bail cover the two cases. The P.M. said he regarded that offence as more heinous than if a man put his hand into another's pocket. He again remanded the accused till Monday, and fixed bail the same as in the previous case.
