

IS HE A RUSSIAN?

ESCAPED FROM INTERNMENT.

Sydney, August 15.

An enquiry into the escape of Nicholas Dorloff from the German concentration camp at Holdsworthy on July 30 was continued to-day at the Victoria Barracks. The issue before the court was whether Dorloff was legally interned, and he pleaded not guilty on the ground that he was a Russian. He said he was born in Riga, of a German mother and a Russian father, and he asked that whatever the decision of the court he should be deported to Russia. After a private consultation with the Russian Consul he was allowed to visit the consulate to undergo certain tests to establish whether he was a Russian, the case being adjourned till next day.
