At the Police Court yesterday morning, before Mr. J. E. Landy, J.P., Lenn. ard Keiss was charged with having, on the previous night, in Down-street; North Ipswich, created a disturbance. Evidence was given by Constable Donald A. Constable Arthur O'Donnell, who was present at the time, also gave evidence. Defendant denied that he had made any noise, and alleged that the police had arrested him when he was walking quietly along the street towards home. He was further charged with having made use of obscene language on the same occasion, and he pleaded Guilty." After evidence had been given by the constables, named defendant was convicted on the first charge, but not punished. On the second charge of having used obscene language he was fined £2, in default seven days.
