

IN MATRIMONIAL JURISDICTION.

AH SEE v. AH SEE.

Mr. A. D. Graham, instructed by Messrs. Atthow and M'Gregor, appeared for plaintiff. There was no appearance of the defendant or co-defendant.

Plaintiff, William Ah See, a half-caste Chinese, sought a dissolution of his marriage with Evelyn Mary Ah See, on the grounds of her alleged misconduct with George Ferber.

After evidence had been given his Honour granted a decree nisi, to be made absolute in three months.

M'FARLANE v. M'FARLANE AND THORLEY.

Mr. Wassell (instructed by Mr. A. W. Bale) appeared for the plaintiff. There was no appearance of the defendant or co-defendant.

Sydney M'Farlane sought a dissolution of his marriage with his wife, Irene M'Farlane, on the grounds of her alleged misconduct with Edward James Thorley. The custody of the children was also asked for.

Mr. Wassell informed the court that since the case had first been called the defendant had pleaded guilty to a charge of bigamy, and had been convicted.

After evidence had been given, his Honour granted a decree nisi, to be made absolute in three months, plaintiff to have the custody of the children. Co-defendant was ordered to pay the costs.
