

## **ATTEMPTED MURDER.**

**SEVEN YEARS HARD FOR  
CHARVILLE PRISONER.**

Charleville, Sept. 22.

In the Circuit Court before His Honor, Mr. Justice Lukin, George Conmand, alias Karl Schultz, was charged with attempting to murder one, Charles Barker, on Boatman run.

The Crown case was that Karl Schultz, who is a native of Warsaw, Poland, was after a bushman named Smith for his money, and that he got to the wrong camp. Barker was sleeping when the Pole struck him with a bar of iron. Barker struggled for life, and a musterer caught and tied Schultz up.

Prisoner was found guilty and sentenced to seven years hard labor.

The Crown quoted where accused had been convicted of offences at Cairns and other centres.
