

"I'LL RAZOR YOU!"

Man's Arm Slashed

"She jumped from the bed, saying: 'I'll do for you,' 'I'll razor you.' Just as I reached the door blood streamed down my arm which had been slashed with a razor."

This evidence was given by Alexander Sast, a blind man, at the Central Police Court to-day.

Mary Edith McDonald, aged 35, was charged with having inflicted grievous bodily harm upon him in a house in Palmer-street, Woolloomooloo, on September 26.

Sast said that he had lived with McDonald as her husband for the last nine months. He had asked her why she drank so heavily, and she became annoyed.

Refusing an application for the charge to be reduced to one of common assault, Mr. Gale, S.M., remarked that if the case went to a higher court a more merciful course probably would be taken than could possibly be at the Central.

McDonald reserved her defence, and was committed for trial. Bail in £40 was granted.
