

TO-DAY'S POLICE COURT.

Michael Carney and Nicholas Tetoll were the only delinquents before the Police Magistrate (Mr. T. W. Farnell) this morning. Both were charged with drunkenness, the former in Denham street, and the latter in Quay street. In Carney's case, Acting-sergeant Burke informed the Bench that six months had elapsed since the defendant had made his first slip, and that being so the P.M. allowed him to go, at the same time expressing the hope that he would not see Carney again for another six months. Referring to Tetoll, Acting-sergeant Burke said that the defendant was before the Court on Monday for drunkenness, and when he was released he had the best part of £12 on him. When arrested last night, Tetoll only had one shilling left. In reply to the Bench, the defendant admitted that he had been hitting the high spots while the money lasted, but he was prepared to go back to his work at Bajool if given a chance. The P.M. was sympathetic, and allowed the defendant to go.
