From the statements made by Senior-sergeant Fowler, in the Police Court yesterday, the visitors had a good time until their cash ran out. Yesterday morning they both pleaded guilty to having attempted to travel between Archer Park and Flaggy Rock without having previously paid their fare. It was further stated by Senior-sergeant Fowler that the defendants had money coming to them, as they had 100 tons of firewood on the ground, for which they had not yet been paid. Each was fined £1, and ordered to pay 2s. 6d. cab fare; in default, 24 hours' imprisonment. Three days were allowed in which to pay the fine.
