**No. 1 Court.**

### **ACQUITTED.**

The hearing was concluded of the charge against Arnold Pemberton Walker, 38, bank clerk, of stealing 200 Commonwealth Bank notes for £5 each, the property of the Australian Bank of Commerce, Ltd., on December 30, 1924. He was alternatively charged with receiving. Mr. H. E. McIntosh appeared for the accused, whose defence was that the notes in his possession were not those which had been stolen.

Accused was acquitted and discharged.

### **ALLEGED INDECENT ASSAULT.**

William Edward George Walker, 35, tailor, was charged with indecently assaulting a little girl, 10 years and two months of age, at La Perouse, on January 2.

Mr. Dovey (instructed by Messrs. Lee and Primrose) appeared for the accused.

Samuel Reginald Bortzell, 33, lift attendant, pleaded guilty to marrying Rossly Otieno, at Sydney, on December 11, 1926, while his first wife, Eileen Theresa May Harwood, whom he had married at Sydney on November 13, 1920, was still alive.

Prisoner was remanded for sentence.

### **WARRANT ISSUED.**

William George Outten, 22, engineer, who was indicted on a charge of housebreaking and receiving, having failed to appear when his name was called, his recognisance was estreated and a Bench warrant ordered to issue for his arrest.
