

FATALITIES AND ACCIDENTS.

RUSSIAN LABORER KILLED.

Neck Crushed by Loaded Waggon.

NARANDERA, Saturday.—This morning John Janus, a Russian, employed by Mr. Herbert, of Jackson's Water Holes, as a farm laborer, came to town with George Herbert for a load of bran and pollard from the flour mill. Janus rode on the top of the load while Herbert walked beside the eight-horse waggon. The horses got out of control and bolted. Some bags fell off, and Janus also fell under the front wheel, which passed over his neck. He was dragged about 100 yards before being released. Death was instantaneous. Janus was about 52 years of age, and a resident of the district for many years. He was a returned oldier and unmarried.
