

## EGG THROWN

### POLITICIAN HIT

### TWO MEN FINED

#### RIOTOUS SYDNEY MEETING

SYDNEY, Saturday.—There was an echo of the notorious Warwick egg incident this morning at the Central Court, when two men were charged as a result of the egg throwing incident last night at Botany, when Mr. T. D. Mutch, of the breakaway Labour party, was addressing a meeting.

Edward Beglot (40), fitter, was charged with throwing a missile at a public speaker in Bunnerong-road, South Kensington.

Constable Skinner said Beglot threw an egg which struck Mr. Mutch on

the chest. He also "counted him out." He was fined £2 or 21 days.

Bartholomew Foster (30), carpenter, also was charged with throwing a missile at Mr. Mutch. It was said that Foster threw a rolled-up piece of paper, which struck the speaker on the chest. Foster was fined £1 or seven days.

The marquee, leased by Mr. Mutch, which was burned in Botany-road about 7.30 p.m., was worth £34.

Also arising from the trouble at the meeting the police made two other arrests. The men apprehended are John Henry Ivin (25), carter, who is charged with having behaved in a riotous manner, and Thomas Healy (42), labourer, against whom the charge is entered of having thrown a missile. The two men will appear at the Redfern Police Court on Monday.
