

POLAND'S NATIONAL DAY.

Question of the Corridor.

"Again there is plotting against Poland. Covetous eyes are being cast on the Polish corridor. I swear that the corridor will be taken by Germany only after the death of the last Pole," said Mr. M. Dann in a patriotic oration at a celebration of Poland's national day on Saturday evening.

Mr. Dann referred to Poland's struggle for freedom. The spirit of the Polish Constitution was indicated by the words at the beginning: "All power in this State emanates from the will of the nation." All classes united in its support, accepting equality, each confident that Poland would soon be a great and prosperous country.

Mr. Dann referred to Australia's progress, and emphasised that "drastic steps should be taken to close the mouths of the dirty assassins who wish to sell your beautiful land to the dirty Bolsheviks."

Mr. G. Skugar, who has been in charge of the Consulate since the death of Mr. G. F. Earp, M.L.C., received visitors, who were representative of the Polish colony in Sydney.
