

FEARS OF WAR

SYDNEY, Friday.—Worry over the possibility of another war, it was suggested at an inquest to-day, had caused John Ludwig Bepper, a returned soldier, to commit suicide.

Mrs. Bepper said that her husband, who was aged 44 years, had been gassed at the Great War and had suffered from the effects periodically. Since March he had been depressed and had said that if people knew what the soldiers had gone through there would never be another war. Her husband had never mentioned taking his own life.

The coroner returned a finding of suicide.
