

## **Pirie War Pensioner Found Dead In Bed**

Mr. John Limbek (about 60), a war pensioner, was found dead in bed about 1 o'clock on Saturday afternoon in one of two rooms which he shared with Mr. F. E. M. Gardthausen in a house occupied by Mr. Mr. D. J. Johns at 45 Pirie street, Solomontown.

The discovery was made by Mr. Johns, who immediately contacted Constable A. T. Hulster, of Solomontown Police Station. After an examination the police officer ordered removal of the body to the morgue. A report will be furnished to Mr. E. T. Cornish (coroner).

Mr. Limbek, a widower, served more than three years in the 1914-18 war. He did not enjoy good health, and spent periods in hospital. During the past two years he was a regular attendant at the outpatients' department at Pirie Hospital. It is believed that he suffered from glandular trouble.

Early on Saturday morning, according to Mr. Gardthausen, his former room-mate complained of feeling unwell, but stated that he did not require a doctor. Mr. Limbek seemed to be sleeping when Mr. Gardthausen arose and went out between 7 and 8 a.m.
